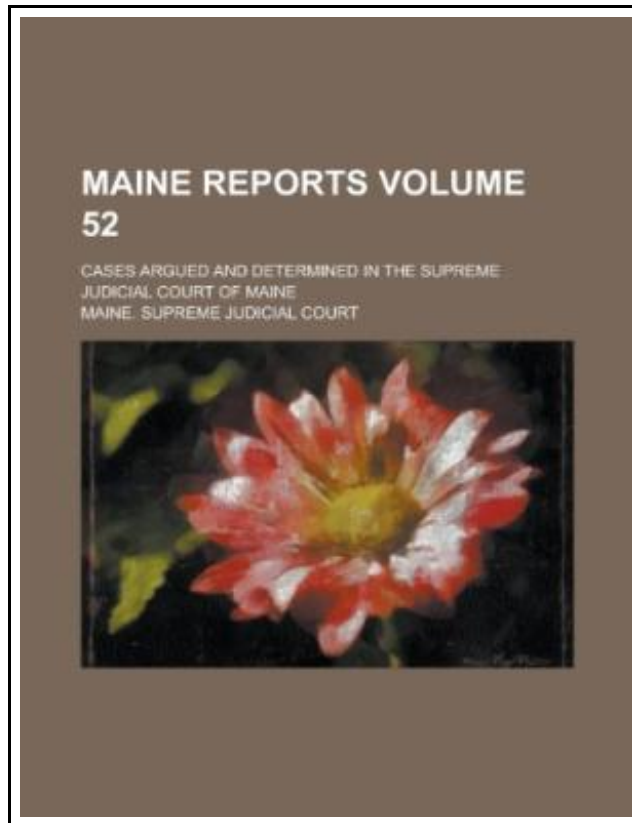

The object was to guard against double insurance, which is an insurance of the same interest. And CADY, J. , says, when it speaks of other insurance on the property it has reference to an insurance to which the assured can resort for apart qfhis indemnity. The clause was inserted in the policy to restrain the insured, if he had more than one policy, from recovering more than a proportional part of the loss on any one policy. We think this construction is reasonable, and must have been intended by the parties. The instruction was therefore correct. i Some questions have been raised in regard to the title to the property described in the policy. But the statute of 1861, c. 34, was in force when the policy was made. There is no special provision in the policy that any mistake in the description of the title or interest of the insured in the property shall render it void.
